

Age-Related Macular Degeneration (ARMD) & Cataract Surgery

r atients with ARMD typically experience a decrease in central vision or a central blind spot and a distortion of straight lines. This greatly affects their ability to read small print, recognize faces and impairs vision at a distance. Cataracts can further reduce peripheral vision and contrast sensitivity, compromising even more the ability to perform activities of daily living. Patients often ask the question "can cataract surgery be safely performed if I have ARMD?." The answer is yes. Patients

with **DRYARMD** may undergo cataract surgery whenever it is indicated, with a clear understanding that the procedure is expected to improve their quality of vision, and that the improvement may translate to clearer peripheral vision, improved light perception and some improvement of the central vision as well. This in turn should improve their quality of life. There is also the additional benefit that the retina specialist will have a better view of the macula for future diagnostic procedures or treatments. Many studies have demonstrated that cataract surgery typically does not contribute to the progression of ARMD. In patients with WET ARMD, new blood vessels underneath the macula bleed or leak fluid. This condition must be treated first and only when it has been under control for several months, and clearance to proceed with cataract surgery is given, should the surgery be performed. The retina specialist will follow this type of patient very closely after cataract surgery.

In summary, several studies have demonstrated that for patients with ARMD who receive cataract surgery benefits in visual outcome and performance of daily activities are much improved.

Vitamins, Vision and You

L he media has saturated us with information on vitamins and herbs that may help prevent some diseases. Almost always, we then hear that these same products may result in terrible side effects or simply not be effective at all. So what are we to believe? We do know that studies have shown that taking a certain amount of vitamins and minerals led to a 25% reduction in Age-Related Macular Degeneration (ARMD). That study has given rise to many companies offering the "AREDS" formula.

I recently discussed the issue of nutrition, vision and health with Dr. Seth J. Baum, a local cardiologist and the inventor of RetinGuard. Dr. Baum's product was invented based on scientific evidence investigated by his company, VitalRemedyMD. Eye Associates of Boca Raton has no financial interest in Dr. Baum's company. I did, however, want to learn more about his products. In easy to understand terms, VitalRemedyMD produces "RetinGuard" a supplement similar to the AREDS formula. There are two major differences. The AREDS formula contains a level of zinc that is associated with anemia. To prevent that, copper is added to prevent anemia. However, if someone ingests more zinc from sources other than AREDS the amount of copper may not be enough to prevent problems. Copper can be toxic at higher levels. RetinGuard reduces the amount of zinc to a safer level.



Additionally, RetinGuard contains three carotenoids, substances which help to prevent damage to the macula. Some studies indicate that carotenoids are actually better absorbed in older people through the use of supplements than from foods such as leafy green vegetables, egg yolks and corn. Does this mean that taking RetinGuard will prevent you from developing ARMD? Sadly, the answer is "no." My advice to my patients is to pay attention to diet, get more exercise and to those who are at risk of developing ARMD take this product instead of the AREDS formula.
